

The Conference and Research Collaboration Fund for Early Career Researchers

The Conference and Research Collaboration Fund for Early Career Researchers (ECRs) has been created to enable ECRs to:

Attend national and international conferences (both in-person and virtual) to present their research, gather valuable feedback and network with peers and others;

Establish a new research collaboration with another university, institute or research team (interdisciplinary, international, cross-university).

ECRs can apply for funds covering conference fees, travel, facility access (e.g., when the new research collaboration requires access to a specialist facility), accommodation and sustenance of up to £800.

Who can apply?

The Conference and Research Collaboration Fund for ECRs is open to research staff (on 'research only' contracts) within 8 years of their PhD award. *

It is aimed specifically at supporting ECRs in their endeavours to develop their own independent research track and standing in their discipline, which is an important part of their personal, professional and career development.

We recognise that our research staff have a diverse range of backgrounds and experiences and come from a variety of research disciplines. We warmly encourage applications from everyone in those communities, including groups who are under-represented in research at our institution.

Doctoral Researchers and Early Career Academics (on 'teaching and research' contracts) are **not** eligible to apply.

**Regarding the 8-year limit, exceptions are being made for staff who have had career breaks and/or are returning to academia from another sector. Please contact us if that is the case.*

Application Process

The Conference and Research Collaboration Fund is an open call with a rolling deadline. However, all funds need to be spent by the end of the financial year, 31st July.

The short Application Form must be submitted electronically to Victoria.Schuppert@brunel.ac.uk. Please contact her if you would like to discuss your application prior to submission.

The application will be assessed based on whether the conference

The awarded funding must be spent in line with the budget specified in your application. Any budget changes must be submitted to the Graduate School for approval;

If you are unable to travel to the conference or go ahead with the research collaboration due to extenuating circumstances, you must notify the Graduate School and forfeit the award.
